ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

General Requirements

Abstracts must present original, unpublished work that is not currently under review elsewhere.

Submissions must be written in clear and concise English.

All abstracts will undergo a blind peer-review process.

Abstract Format

Word limit: 250–300 words

Keywords: 3–5 keywords

Font (if uploading full abstract): Times New Roman, 11 or 12 pt

Spacing: Single spacing

Content Structure

Abstracts should clearly include the following components:

- Background / Rationale – Context and purpose of the study
- Objectives – Research aims or questions
- Methodology – Research design, participants, instruments, and procedures
- Findings – Key results (or expected outcomes for work-in-progress)
- Implications – Contributions to LSP theory, practice, or policy

Review Criteria

Abstracts will be evaluated based on:

- Relevance to conference theme
- Originality and significance
- Clarity and coherence
- Methodological rigour
- Practical and/or theoretical contribution

Important Notes

Incomplete submissions or those that do not follow the guidelines may be rejected.

Authors will be notified of acceptance via email.

Accepted presenters must register and pay the conference fee to be included in the programme.

Submission Process

All abstracts must be submitted via the official Google Form:

Ensure all required fields are completed accurately.

Submission implies agreement with the conference policies and review process.

Ethical Considerations

Authors must ensure that ethical approval has been obtained where necessary.
