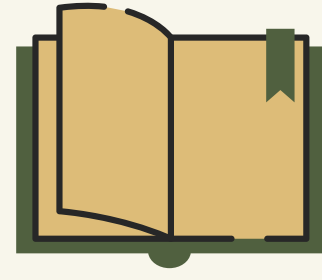

ROLE PLAY ELCA TALK SHOW



Role playing a show with a host (the person hosting or running the show) who has different celebrities as guests on each episode and interviews them. They talk about any topics that celebrate young people's ingenuity and resourcefulness such as projects, play games and have short comedy segment.



Objectives

- (i) To compose a short talk-show script
- (ii) To motivate students to use English language intuitively by using:

Natural conversations. The great thing about talk shows is while they have games and activities, the style is more like an interview. The host has to ask questions and keep the conversation going, so this is great for learning how to have a long conversation naturally.

Pop culture and slang. Whatever movies, books or TV shows are at the moment will come up on talk shows, as well as any new slang terms. There are also a lot of parts that mention politics, so you'll get to see new political terms in context.



TASK:

- Students will have to create a script based on assigned roles.
- The host and a maximum of three guests will be given descriptions of their characters and will discuss topics that celebrate young people's ingenuity and resourcefulness, and at the same time entertain questions from viewers.
- The total number of participants for the activity is between eight to nine.



- Participants are required to produce a 20-25 minute pre-recorded talk show episode including the short comedy segment.
- The format allows participants to speak out in a lively yet relaxed discourse where engagement matters more than correctness of form.

Mc: Alright, let's hop onto the first question. Do you think you can make it big when you first start your journey?

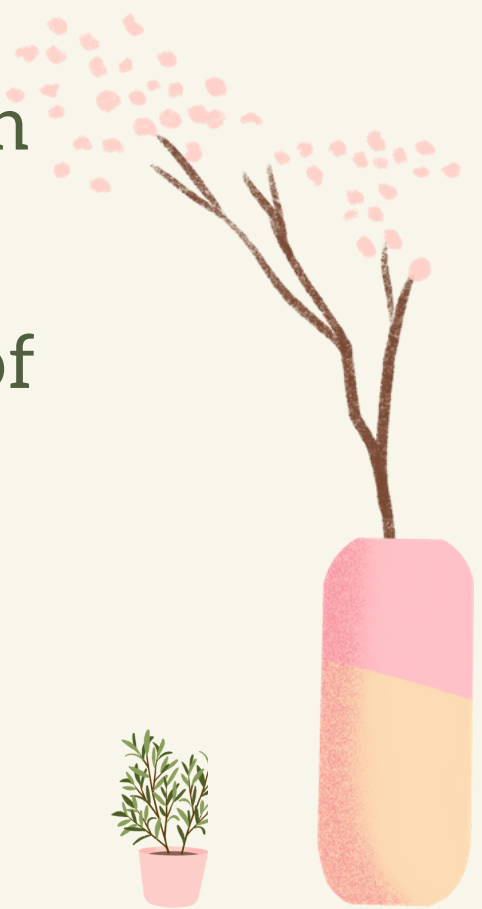
Aiman: No I don't. I just want to share some recipes since I think it is beneficial for others.
