The course will be conducted fully online through asynchronous and synchronous sessions.

- Asynchronous sessions involve self-directed learning activities by using reading and video materials provided on E-Learning.

MAIN MODULES

The course is divided into **three modules**:

MODULE 1: DOING CRITICAL REVIEW

Synopsis: The aim of this module is to develop students' knowledge and understanding of the role and conduct of social science research. To assist students to develop informed opinions and critical appreciation for other research, the students will be introduced to the processes involved in identifying and determining researchable social science issues based on literature. The ethical issues will also be addressed.

MODULE 2: FRAMING YOUR RESEARCH ISSUE AND DECIDING ON RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

Synopsis: In this module, students will be exposed to processes involved in formulating researchable issues. Doing research is a process with layers of intertwining activities which demands students to decide and able to justify their decision for their research. Research entails rigorous processes which are based on underlying philosophical framework which directs and permeates the use of certain procedures, methods and techniques that are valid and reliable which makes a research to be unbiased. organizable and objective. Thus, deciding on a research design does not have a cookie-cutter way that suit for every researcher or students who are planning to conduct a research. It is based on the issues that researchers want to explore and investigate. In this case, formulating research issues is among the initial process prior to deciding on any research design. "What do you want to explore and investigate?" is the key question that any researcher would ask to begin their research journey which have been covered in Module 1. Module 2 is the continuation of Module 1 in which the focus would be on framing research issue(s) or problem(s) and determining research methodology (which includes research design, sampling design, data collection process and analysis).

MODULE 3: PLANNING ON RESEARCH

Synopsis: Planning a research starts from identification of research problems or issues understudy and follows by series of processes such as systematic literature review, deciding on research design, constructing instruments for data collection and such. In this module, students will be exposed to strategies and tips to structure the writing up of academic research project. In specific, discussion of preparation of research proposal will also be included in this course. The discussion of research proposal will cover the key points of proposal writing based on UTM Thesis Manual.
